

# Educational Studies

Students with an Educational Studies major or minor can pursue careers in informal learning environments (e.g., recreational programs, zoos, museums, ecology centers) as well as a wide range of non-profit organizations and foundations. Educational Studies majors are also positioned to complete graduate or professional programs in disciplines such as educational policy, psychology, counseling, social work, communications, organizational leadership, teaching, higher education, or law, among others. Students who select the major must complete the following components:

1. The Marquette Core Curriculum (MCC).
2. Environmental Science course: ARSC 1020, BIOL 1420, PHYS 1007 or PHYS 1009
3. An additional academic major from the Klingler College of Arts and Sciences or the Diederich College of Communication.

Students who intend to complete the Educational Studies major or minor through the Marquette University College of Education are strongly encouraged to meet with the assistant dean of undergraduate advising and student services in the Office of Teacher Education as early as possible to avoid delays in their program.

- <sup>4</sup> The four courses in the Discovery Tier (DSCV) of the MCC must be completed in the same theme and include the following content areas: Humanities (HUM), Social Science (SSC), Natural Science and Mathematics (NSM), and one elective (ELE), which is an additional course from any of the three content areas. A maximum of two courses in the Discovery Tier can apply towards a primary major.
- <sup>5</sup> Students must also complete the Writing Intensive (WRIT) and Engaging Social System and Values 2 (ESSV2) requirements of the MCC. These requirements can be fulfilled through designated courses in the Discovery Tier or other degree requirements.

## Educational Studies Minor

Students interested in a minor in Educational Studies should consult the assistant dean of the College of Education Undergraduate Advising and Student Services. The Educational Studies minor requires 18 credit hours: Two courses (EDUC 1210 , EDUC 1220 ) require participation in 20 hours of service-learning experiences, and one course (EDUC 4986 Community-Engaged Internship I) requires a minimum of 140 hours in an internship experience. The three additional Educational Studies electives also require service learning.
